This position is based in Arlington, Virginia.

Reporting Relationships

This position reports to the Director of Community Programs and works within a team 2-3 additional staff members. The Humane Education Assistant will also work closely with League staff, volunteers, and the public.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Plan, coordinate, and implement Humane Education Presentation content
- Co-lead Humane Education Presentations and League Tours
- Follow up with Guest Speakers when necessary
- Facilitate daily art and craft activities for each of the four Day Camps
- Resolve issues and provide support concerning campers either pre or post registration through email, phone consults, and in person
- Organize and track camper registration
- Answer correspondence and follow up with registrants as needed
- Additional duties as assigned

Required Qualifications

- 24 College credits (childhood education preferred)
- Current enrollment in an undergraduate program with a full-time status
- Full time Fall 2014 enrollment as a sophomore, junior, or senior for (minimum of 12 credit hours)
- Excellent communication and counseling skills
- Strong public speaking skills including experience presenting information to a wide variety of audiences
- Exceptional interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to write clearly and effectively
- Demonstrated ability to engage, inspire and instruct children



- Available to work all camp dates/times, 35 hours per week for 8 weeks (June 16th August 8th)
- Computer literacy including MS Word, Excel, Email and Database skills

- Student working towards a degree in Early Childhood Education or related field
- Experience in the field of animal welfare or animal shelter

Typical Physical & Mental Demands

Requires prolonged sitting or standing with some bending, stooping and stretching, eye-hand coordination and manual dexterity sufficient to operate a keyboard, telephone, photocopier, calculator and other office equipment. May be required to lift items and animals and be physically active. Requires normal range of hearing and eyesight to communicate with shelter animals, the public, volunteers, campers, and staff. Also requires flexibility to readily adapt to a fast paced ever changing environment.

Must enjoy working with children.

Must be comfortable handling dogs, cats, and small companion animals.

Compensation

This is a part time, temporary, 35 hour per week, non-exempt, hourly position beginning on June 16th with an anticipated end date of August 8th, 2014. There are no medical benefits or vacation/sick time associated with this position. Compensation for this position is \$9.82 per hour, paid on a bi-weekly basis.
