The Medical Center is the only local veterinary facility that offers discounted, full-service care to income-qualified residents of the District of Columbia; Calvert, Charles, Frederick, Montgomery, and Prince George's counties in Maryland; Arlington, Clarke, Fairfax, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William, Spotsylvania, Stafford, and Warren counties in Virginia; the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Manassas, and Manassas Park in Virginia; and Jefferson County, West Virginia.*

Vetco provides a variety of low-cost Vaccines and Tests for dogs and cats at Petco and Unleashed stores across the US. They offer convenient evening and weekend hours, no office visit fee and no appointment is needed.
- AWLA offers rabies vaccines for \$10 at our Rabies & Microchip clinics (microchipping is \$30) – see info and dates <http://www.awla.org/rabies-clinics.shtml>. **Please Note:** *the only vaccine available at the AWLA clinic is the Rabies vaccine. If you need other types of low-cost vaccines and/or tests (examples: Distemper/Parvo combo, Bordetella, Heartworm test, FeLv/FIV test, etc.), we recommend that you contact the Vetco clinics.*
