The Medical Center is the only local veterinary facility that offers discounted, full-service care to income-qualified residents of the District of Columbia; Calvert, Charles, Frederick, Montgomery, and Prince George's counties in Maryland; Arlington, Clarke, Fairfax, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William, Spotsylvania, Stafford, and Warren counties in Virginia; the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Manassas, and Manassas Park in Virginia; and Jefferson County, West Virginia.*
- If you have not ever been a client at Columbia Pike Animal Hospital (Annandale) or Town & Country Animal Hospital (Fairfax), you can print a "New Client" coupon from their website, use it on your first vet visit and they will waive the office exam fee
